- Strong's 1577
- Combination of:
 - ek (Strong's 1537) – out of
 - kaleo (Strong's 2564) to call
- ekklesia = to call out, an assembly
- a common Greek word – not a religious word

- circe
- kuriakon

Neither word is found
in the Greek New
Testament.

The Feast of Pentecost, celebrated the fiftieth day after Easter, commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles and the birth of the Church.

Jesus Christ founded the New Testament Church in the city of Jerusalem on the biblical festival of Pentecost 50 days after His resurrection from the dead.

Between the time of His resurrection and the founding of His Church, Christ appeared to His apostles over the course of the first 40 days, further enlightening them concerning the nature of the coming Kingdom of God (Acts:1:3).

During that time "He commanded them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the Promise of the Father" (verse 4). He explained to them, "You shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth" (verse 8) . . . Therefore the Church, the spiritually transformed body of believers, began when Christ's apostles received the Holy Spirit, just as He had promised (Acts:2:1-4).

the Septuagint

- 2nd and 3rd century BCE
- Greek translation of the Tanakh
- LXX - 70



ekklesia (Greek)= **kahal** (Hebrew)

- kahal קהל (Strong's 6951) = assembly
- translates into a variation of assembly over 100 times

ekklesia (Greek)= kahal (Hebrew)

^{NKJ} Joshua 8:34-35 And afterward he (Joshua) read all the words of the law, the blessings and the cursings, according to all that is written in the Book of the Law. ³⁵ There was not a word of all that Moses had commanded which Joshua did not read before all the ~~assembly~~ *church* of Israel, with the women, the little ones, and the strangers who were living among them.

^{NKJ} Acts 20:28 "Therefore take heed to yourselves and to all the flock, among which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to shepherd the ~~church~~ *assembly* of God which He purchased with His own blood.

^{KJV} 1 Chronicles 28:8 Now therefore in the sight of all Israel the ~~congregation~~ *assembly* of the LORD, and in the audience of our God, keep and seek for all the commandments of the LORD your God: that ye may possess this good land, and leave it for an inheritance for your children after you for ever.

Review -

- “church” is not a good translation of the Greek “ekklesia”
- ekklesia = assembly
