^{ESV} Mark 1:14-16 ¹⁴ Now after John was arrested, Jesus came into Galilee, proclaiming the gospel of God, ¹⁵ and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent and believe in the gospel." ¹⁶ Passing alongside the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and Andrew the brother of Simon casting a net into the sea, for they were fishermen.

^{ESV} Mark 1:1-3 The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. ² As it is written in Isaiah the prophet, "Behold, I send my messenger before your face, who will prepare your way, ³ the voice of one crying in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight.'"

And he said to them, "Do not extort money from anyone by threats or by false accusation, and be content with your wages."

Every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire."

Are you Elijah?" He said, "I am not." "Are you the Prophet?" And he answered, "No."

ESV Luke 20:1 One day, as Jesus was teaching the people in the temple and preaching the gospel, the chief priests and the scribes with the elders came up ² and said to him, "Tell us by what authority you do these things, or who it is that gave you this authority."³ He answered them, "I also will ask you a question.
