Correcting the Current Dogma

Israel and Judah Together

- ◆ Prior to David dynasty, Israel was a divided nation (2 Sam. 2:8). There were wars between Israel and Judah (2 Sam. 2:12; 3:1)
- ◆ 7 ½ years into David's reign, he became King over both Judah and Israel (2 Sam. 5:1-3)



Israel and Judah Together

So Solomon sat on the throne of David his father, and his kingdom was firmly established.

ESV 1 Kings 2:12



Peace

- ◆ Solomon was left with a strong military – Over 1 ½ million men strong!

Then Joab gave the sum of the number of the people to David. All Israel had one million one hundred thousand men who drew the sword, and Judah had four hundred and seventy thousand men who drew the sword.

(1 Chronicles 21:5)

Peace

²¹ Solomon ruled over all the kingdoms from the Euphrates to the land of the Philistines and to the border of Egypt . . .

²⁴ For he had dominion over all the region west of the Euphrates from Tiphseh to Gaza, over all the kings west of the Euphrates. And he had **peace on all sides** around him. ²⁵ And Judah and Israel **lived in safety**, from Dan even to Beersheba, every man **under his vine and under his fig tree**, all the days of Solomon.


(1 Kings 4:21-25)



Wealth

- ◆ Solomon asked for the wisdom to righteously govern God's Kingdom
- ◆ Riches and Honor were given to him
- ◆ Gold became as common as stones (2 Chron. 1:15)
- ◆ Silver was so common it was considered to have no value. (1 Kings 10:21)

Wealth



For the king's ships went to Tarshish with the servants of Hiram. Once every three years the merchant ships came, bringing gold, silver, ivory, apes, and monkeys. ²² **So King Solomon surpassed all the kings of the earth in riches and wisdom.**

A Word About Phoenicia

- ◆ Rose to greatness 1000 BC
- ◆ Vast maritime empire
- ◆ Major cities were Tyre and Sidon
- ◆ Located just north of Israel
- ◆ Only 10 – 15 miles wide

Happiness

- ◆ The people's happiness exceeded the expectations of visiting dignitaries. (2 Chronicles 9:3-7)
- ◆ The people had confidence in their king and his judgements (1 Kings 3:28)



2 Chronicles 9:3-7 “And when the queen of Sheba had seen the wisdom of Solomon, the house that he had built,
4 the food on his table, the seating of his servants, the service of his waiters and their apparel, his cupbearers and their apparel, and his entryway by which he went up to the house of the LORD, there was no more spirit in her. 5 Then she said to the king: “It was a true report which I heard in my own land about your words and your wisdom.
6 “However I did not believe their words until I came and saw with my own eyes; and indeed the half of the greatness of your wisdom was not told me. You exceed the fame of which I heard. 7 “Happy are your men and happy are these your servants, who stand continually before you and hear your wisdom!”



Fulfilling Israel's Purpose

- ◆ The world was coming to hear Solomon's wisdom (1 Kings 10:23-24)
- ◆ Israel had the opportunity to teach God's ways to the nations (1 Kings 10:25)

YHVH in Their Midst

- ◆ He would dwell among them
- ◆ God's glory filled the Temple





YHVH in Their Midst

- ◆ ¹² "*Concerning* this temple which you are building, if you walk in My statutes, execute My judgments, keep all My commandments, and walk in them, then I will perform My word with you, which I spoke to your father David. ¹³ "And I will dwell among the children of Israel, and will not forsake My people Israel." (1 Kings 6:12-13)
